You lived the purpose that you were given from the beginning of your walk with Me. We have co-labored together. The results are what was intended from your birth. You were born to LOVE. All my children who love and obey Me will realize their purpose in life and each joint will connect and supply what is needed in their ministry on earth, whether in their homes, jobs or wherever they spend their lives in relationship with God their Father, Jesus Christ, their Savior and the Holy Spirit, their Director.*

God did it, and the fruit of our obedience is great. This celebration will be a testimony of unity and love.”

A TIME TO PRAY

Destruction around the world is an everyday occurrence, and we are reminded of God’s call for intercession in Isaiah 59:16 and Ezekiel 22:30. *“He saw that there was no man, and wondered that there was no intercessor; and He spoke protest. I sought for a man among them, that should make up the hedge and stand in the gap before ME for the land ... but I found none.”*

Let us be people who will pray and not faint. Even though the world is in great turmoil, do not become distracted from God’s call upon His people. We must not be overtaken by bad news (Psalm 112:7). In spite of how desperate the situations are in the world, especially in this nation, God’s promises will stand. Remember how desperate the situations were in Jerusalem when Nehemiah received the news about the afflictions of God’s people and the broken conditions in Jerusalem? He first acknowledged that he was part of the problem (Nehemiah 1:6-7). He also acknowledged that he was afraid (Nehemiah 2:2) to go to Jerusalem and rebuild it. He overcame his guilt and fear and acknowledged God as the Lord of heaven, the great and awesome God

who preserves His covenant and loving kindness for those who love Him and keep His commandments (Nehemiah 1:5). Nehemiah believed that as he turned to God in prayer, God would be faithful to intervene according to His own promises.

We must remember that God's promises are true. He does not lie.

PURPOSE February-March, 2011 THE JOURNEY ONWARD

Each year at our Prayer Renewals, God gives us words of direction and encouragement. As I looked back at some of our directives, I found one written January 21, 2001. Whenever God gives a vision to a saint He puts him/her in the palm of His hand, and the saint's duty is to be still and listen. The Holy Spirit gave these words.

"I have brought you this far. There have been times on this journey when you have lost your focus doing what you thought pleased me—all that is past. Now, when our relationship is threatened you are not content. Rest now in me, make plans for the growth of the ministry, and I will direct you by My Holy Spirit. All that you have lost will be restored, for it will glorify Me. Our time spent together is precious, but you will continue to learn that we are together in all that you do."

PURPOSE Fall, 2009 FROM THE PRESIDENT

The question every believer should frequently ask themselves: "How do I represent Jesus Christ to the world?" I ask myself that question more often now than ever before as I observe the worldwide spiritual warfare being waged against the people of God that was written about in Revelation 13:7. It is the attack of Satan against the body of Christ. *"It was given unto him to make war with the saints."* Every believer is a participant in the army of God, and Satan is waging war against us. The Apostle Paul states that on every battlefield, *"we do not war after the flesh ... the weapons of our warfare are not carnal ... they are mighty through God to the pulling down of strongholds."* (2 Corinthians 10:3-4)

It seems every institution is being infiltrated by ungodly spiritual powers. Unfortunately, in the minds of too many Christians, these ungodly principalities seem to be winning. Not so, we already know how this

war ends. It was finished at the cross in VICTORY by the shed blood of Jesus Christ. Paul tells us, *"The weapons of our warfare are ... mighty through God to the pulling down of strongholds. Casting down imaginations, and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ."* (2 Corinthians 10:4-5)

Returning to the initial question, how do we represent God in these horrific times? — First, we should examine ourselves whether we are in the faith. (2 Corinthians 13:5)

In this battlefield we must fight the good fight of faith and lay hold of eternal life (1 Timothy 6:12) ... *"without faith it is impossible to please Him"* ... (Hebrews 11:6)

We must endure our own private wars with burdens that we cannot carry, that no one else can help us with. We must bear our own burdens, *"for every man shall bear his own burden."* (Galatians 6:5)

When these burdens seem too heavy to bear, we are not to give up and become weary in our well doing, for this is just a season to test our endurance ... *"in due season we shall reap, if we do not faint."* (Galatians 6:9)

By our faith, we will find the courage to continue to fight, by our love we will prove that we are disciples of Jesus Christ. As saints of God who love and obey Him, we will have seasons of weariness and heaviness of heart. We will be war-worn. Through all our adversities we can represent Jesus Christ on the battlefield because we, *"are kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation, ready to be revealed in the last time. Wherein ye greatly rejoice, though now, for a season, if need be, ye are in heaviness through manifold temptations (adversities)."* (1 Peter 1:5-6)

KENYA The U.S. team flew into Jomo Kenyatta International Airport on the 25th of March and were driven to Nakuru by Reverend David Musumba, team leader, where they were blessed with housing and meals during their stay. Sharing meals, living together with their hosts, getting to know each other, there was a bonding and they began to feel like family.


The meetings in Kenya were very inspiring and the team ministered to the women, the men and the young people, encouraging them to be steadfast in the divine things of God.

While there they visited the Rhonda water project. Now it only remains to install the pump and solar panels. They also met with the local communities, who are the direct beneficiaries of the water project, and learned of the impact of the project in the community and the joy people have with the project in solving their suffering.

The team wound up their stay in Kenya with a special session for the men. Reverend Duncan spoke to the men, *in a man's language*, on how to be a real *Man of Purpose*. It was so inspiring that the people felt they could have stayed much longer, but the team had to leave for Malawi.



MALAWI From Kenya, the team traveled to Blantyre, Malawi in southern Africa at the invitation of Apostle Andrew Mataka. This is the first time Women and Men of Purpose (WMYPOP) have entered this region of Africa. One hundred people (two people each from fifty different churches) were invited to Blantyre, Malawi for five days to receive teaching and training to take back to their home congregations. There are at least



ten other countries that Apostle Mataka is urging us to visit in southern Africa.

The mission to Blantyre, Malawi was very successful. The team stayed in the home of Apostle Andrew Mataka, sharing meals and being transported as needed.

The conference had a total of 188 people who attended every day from morning to noon, teaching on Reconciliation, Restoration and Renewal. (*Photo of the group is on the front page*). Reverend Sherman Duncan trained the leaders on mentorship and took them through the ministries manual on the subject. Alvin Beal spoke on the *Grace of Servanthood* in ministry. Apostle Mataka has appointed a couple (man and wife) to lead the first group of WMYPOPI in Malawi.

UGANDA From Malawi, the team traveled to Uganda where the first Women of Purpose International multi-country *United in Love Conference*, under the direction of Ms. Judith Mbabazi, was held in 2016. Since that time seven Women, Men and Young People of Purpose International groups (WMYPOPI) have been established in various parts of Uganda for the purpose of sharing the love of Jesus and to help foster better conditions, particularly for women and children living in a very depressed economy.

GHANA

After Alvin and Sherman returned to the U.S., Reverend Musumba traveled on to Ghana, another country that our WMYPOPI teams visited in 2016. Our Ghana Director, Mrs. Gifty Ofosu-Fiator, had arranged for Reverend



Musumba to meet with several Ghana chapters of WMYPOPI. Of particular joy was the opportunity for Reverend Musumba to speak and teach the Christian men associated with WMYPOPI. And this year we have added to our WMYPOPI connective ministries *Palm Institute*, a school founded by Dr. Peter Carlos Okantey and his wife, Beth, and dedicated to providing higher education for promising students from the villages and farm lands around Accra, Ghana.



When Rev. Musumba and Gifty visited Palm Institute, Pastor Musumba shared briefly about the vision and purpose of WMYPOPI. He prayed a very powerful prayer from *Leviticus 26:9* over the school, staff and faculty. The formation and establishment of a chapter of Women, Men and Young People of Purpose International at the Palm Institute was announced. The institute is appointing leaders and will commission them as the Lord leads to empower them to help promote the core values of WMYPOPI in Palm Institute. The Ghanaian Chapter of WOPI in Ghana will be housed at the college. We are honored to connect with Dr. Okantey in this unified endeavor.

PALM INSTITUTE, Madina, Ghana, West Africa

The Palm Institute is an independent private non-profit organization registered in Ghana. It was founded by Dr. Peter Carlos Okantey and his wife, Beth.



From Palm Institute Reverend Musumba and Gifty drove to Kumasi in Mampong teng Ashanti Region - a 5 hour drive there and 5 hours back to Accra. Mampong teng is a small town and is the capital of Kwabre, a district of Ashanti. There they met the newest chapter led by Rev. Agyemang and the people there were very encouraged by the visit. This is one of the newest chapters in Ghana and was inaugurated by our African Ambassador, Rev. David Musumba.

From there they visited Aboabo Chapter Eastern Region and consoled the family of the coordinator who had died recently. They were introduced to the concept of starting table banking for the women's groups where they could take small loans from among the group resources and start small businesses for their sustainability. It was the first time the Aboabo ladies had heard about pooling their resources together by beginning small and growing their businesses. They have shown great interest in the concept which will be followed up.

Meetings were also held in GNAT hall in Accra, and it was very successful with a total participation drawn from both the Women, Men and Young People of Purpose representing all the chapters, and the coordinators were present. They spoke of Reconciliation, Restoration and Renewal encouraging the people to stay steadfast in the Word of God and seek the face of the Father to walk together in Unity.

The meetings were very successful and Director Gifty was so happy by the end of the conference. She met with the Chapter coordinators and answered all their questions, giving them a clear and proper direction for the ministry in Ghana.


